Laura Bell loved animals and raised many loyal Beagle dogs, cats, goats, and horses. Laura Bell served the County in the Civil Defense and Women's Auxiliary. 3. Maintain at least a "C" average

Terms of Scholarship

The award will be given to a graduate of a Crawford County Illinois High School who is pursuing a trade profession, or is currently enrolled in a trade profession curriculum, has maintained a "C" average and is attending a program located in the Tri-State area. The winner will be announced at Senior Honors night. The amount of the scholarship will be based on the total net income earned by the Trust during the previous calendar year divided by the number of qualified successful applicants.
